Adapted from the Augustinians of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and from St. John Chrysostom.

For our Parish Family, and for all who enter it with faith, reverence, and love of God, let us pray to the Lord. *Lord, have mercy*.

For our Pope Francis and our Bishop David, for the priesthood, the diaconate, the religious life, and all the people of God, let us pray to the Lord. *Lord, have mercy*.

For our elected officials and civil authorities, for First Responders and health care professionals, and for all in service of our country in the military, let us pray to the Lord. Lord, have mercy.
