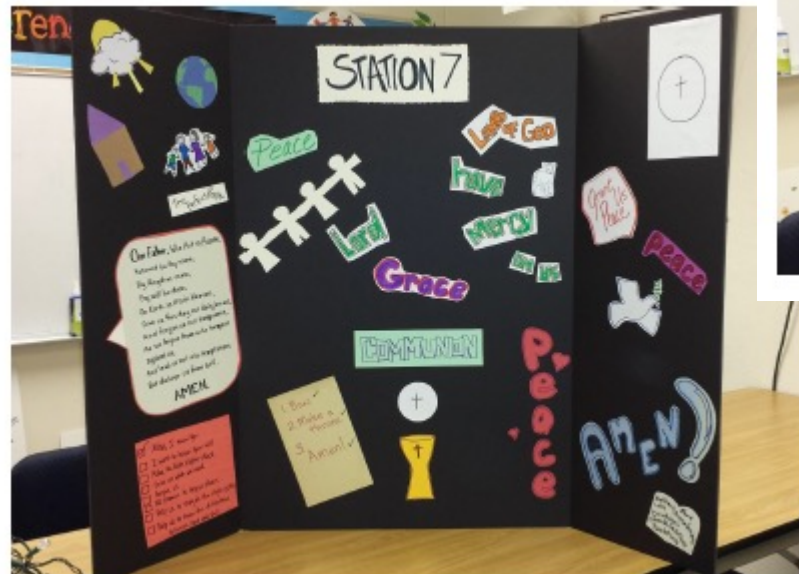

We ask you to help us see and hear you when we enter Mass.

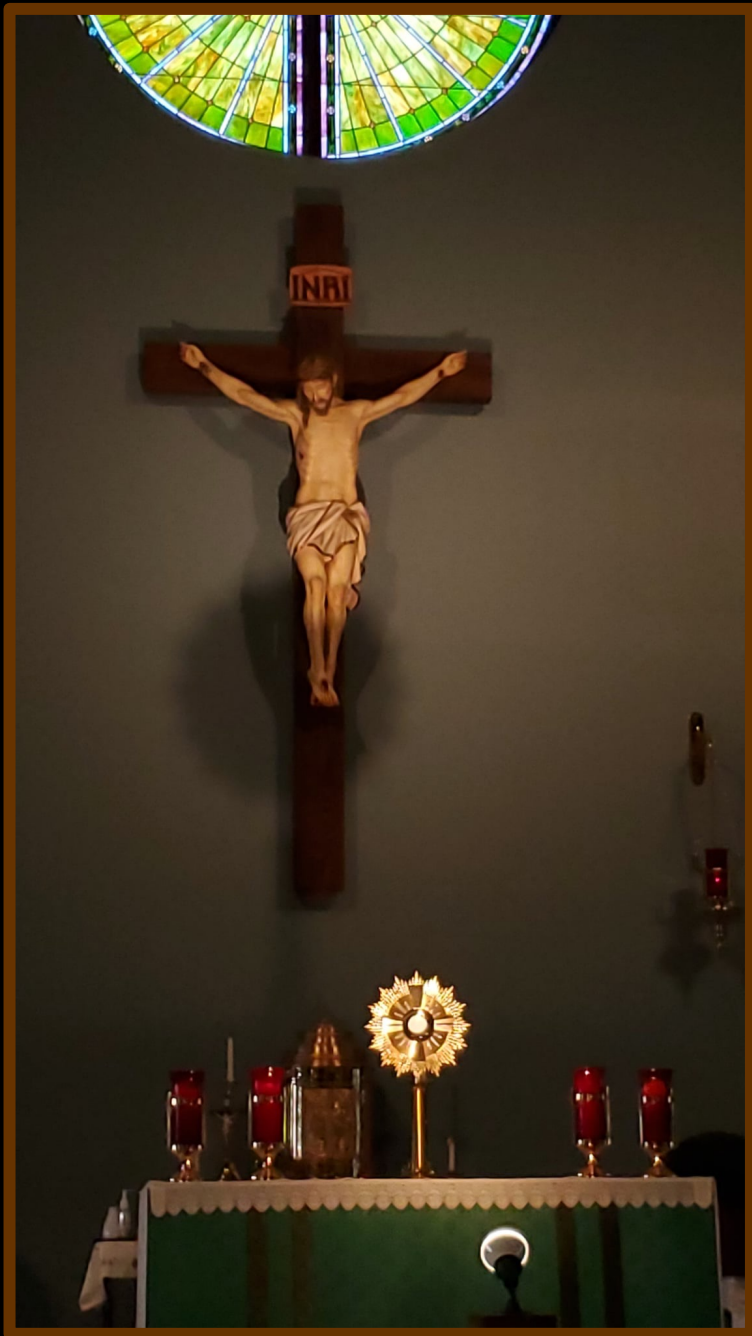
We ask you to transform us into witnesses of your love and care.
