HOW DO WE BUILD A CULTURE OF LIFE NOW?

Abortion has been everywhere in the news during the past couple months. We have seen certain states pass legislation lifting virtually all restrictions on abortion (New York, Maine, Vermont, Nevada, and, most recently, our own state of Illinois). We have seen others states pass legislation restricting abortion (Alabama, Georgia, Louisiana, Ohio, Missouri, etc.). We have heard high profile politicians and celebrities take sides. Perhaps you have found yourself drawn into debates with friends and family?

In the midst of this raging controversy I want us to remember some things.

First, a lot of post-abortive women are witnessing this debate. A lot of post-abortive men are witnessing this debate, as well (we often forget the effect abortion has on men). We should always remember to be concerned with the human person at the other end of a conversation or a social media exchange. **Abortion is not just an abstract political hot-topic. For many people, it is personal.** According to the Guttmacher Institute (the research arm of Planned Parenthood) 24 percent of women who procure abortions identify as Catholic. We need to be conscious of the fact that a person that we are talking to about abortion might have had an abortion themselves or might know someone who has had one. That does not mean that we avoid discussing this central human rights issue. However, **as Catholic Christians, we should always be people of hope rather than condemnation.** We should be heralds of the Good News that healing is available through the mercy of Jesus Christ! We need to share the truth in love and listen to others as much as we speak. Any post-abortive women who are seeking healing should consider checking out the **Project Rachel ministry** by calling 815-387-3379 (speak to Laura) or emailing projectrachelrockford@gmail.com (website: www.hopeafterabortion.com). All inquiries are handled in a private and confidential manner. As a priest, I have served as a contact for Project Rachel and am happy to meet with anyone who is seeking someone to listen to them and/or pray with them, without the fear of being judged or condemned.

We should be concerned with walking with vulnerable men and women who are susceptible to temptation to seek abortion. In 2018, the website FemCatholic conducted an anonymous survey of women who have had an abortion. Some of the questions included: *“What do you think was needed before the abortion? What resources or support was available? Would any other resources or specific support have changed the choice that was made?”* In summary, the respondents made the following general points:

First: No one told her that it was possible to have the baby or showed confidence in her ability to be a mom. On the contrary, she was told that everyone would be better off if the child is aborted.

Second: She did not know about practical resources that could help her choose life (how to finish school, alternatives for student housing, mentors, financial aid opportunities, daycare options, etc.).

Third: Parents, family, and friends were not supportive of her having an unplanned birth/child out of wedlock.

Fourth: Some chastity/abstinence messages made her feel such shame for her past decisions that she sought out abortion in order to keep her moral failing a secret. The virtue of chastity must be taught with an emphasis on human freedom, God's mercy and grace rather than fear and shame.

Fifth: Circumstances were dire, and she felt she had no other choice.

Sadly, government leadership within Illinois has passed legislature with the goal of making our state the most "progressive" state when it comes to abortion. Abortion will continue to plague our culture. As Catholic Christians, we do need to continue to speak out against the evil of abortion. **We need to continue to focus on the dignity of the human person**—the women and men who are tempted by abortion, the doctors and health care workers who provide abortion, and, of course, the tiny human person developing in the womb. Abortion hurts all of them. Do not be fooled by ubiquitous political formulations (e.g. "except in cases of rape and incest")! A fetus conceived in rape or incest is still a human person who has inherent value and does not deserve to die for the sin of their father. Focus on the human person!

In addition to engaging in charitable discourse about abortion we also need to do what Christians have always been known for: we need to love. Let's look around at our community: our family, our friends, our school, our town. Let's examine how we talk about "unplanned pregnancy." Do we love life even when it does not come into existence according to God's plan for marriage and the family? Do we see a young woman who needs to be assured that she has what it takes to be a mom to a baby that she did not anticipate having in less-than-ideal situations? Do we know of a young man who needs to be firmly reminded of his masculine calling to exercise responsibility, support the woman in his life and protect the vulnerable life that he helped generate? Are we aware of resources that could help men and women more easily choose life? Are we willing to become *resources* for them? How would we react if a family member told us that they had sinned sexually or became pregnant out of wedlock? Would we shame them and kick them out of the house? Or, would we offer love and support? Do we talk about the evils of abortion in such a way that a post-abortive individual might think that they had no hope of forgiveness from God? To live the Gospel of life means to love others in need and offer them hope! In a future article I will discuss some of the ways that we can charitably argue for the pro-life position.

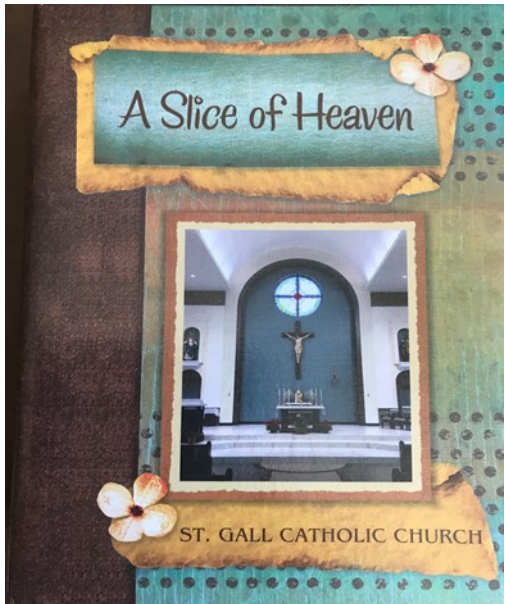

at the church office or at Old Second Bank, across from Jewel, for \$18.00 each. Checks should be made payable to the Saint Vincent de Paul Society.

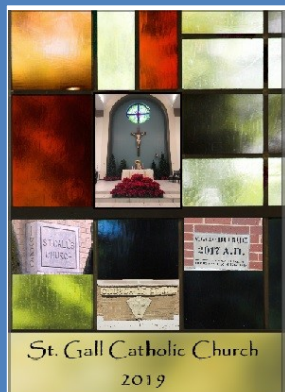
Venture Crew Pancake Breakfast

ST. GALL RESEPECT LIFE

During the summer months is a great time to pray the Divine Chaplet for all mothers in a crisis pregnancy. Pray for all unborn children in the womb and for our legislators and nation who pass laws that do NOT protect the unborn child. Pray the Chaplet on your morning or afternoon walks; while sitting outside in your favorite chair; at the beach, at sunrise or sundown...just pray!

How to Recite the Chaplet

The Chaplet of Mercy is recited using ordinary rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the Diary of Saint Faustina and followed by a closing prayer.

1. Make the Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

2. Optional Opening Prayers

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat three times)

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!

3. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

4. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

5. The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

6. The Eternal Father

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the remaining decades

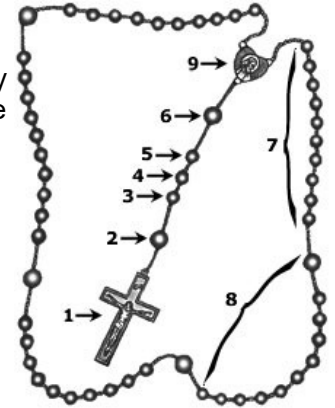
Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

10. Optional Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

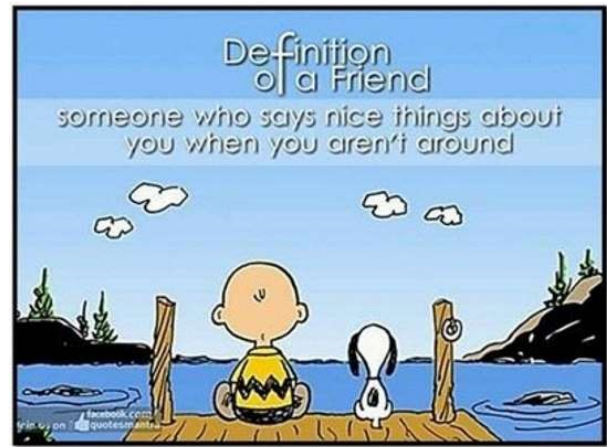

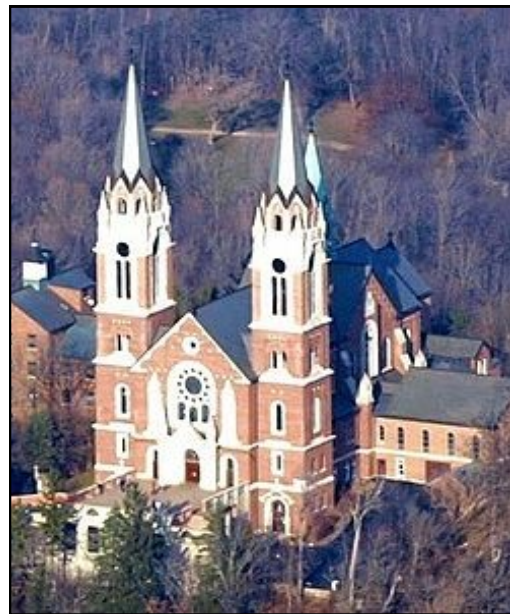

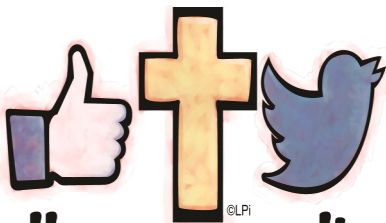
