WE ARE FOLLOWERS OF THE RISEN LORD JESUS

WHY we follow Jesus

Go therefore and <u>make disciples</u> of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, <u>I am with you always</u>, to the close of the age (Matthew 28:19-20).

These were the words of the Risen Jesus as he commissioned the eleven apostles.

As Pastor of St. Gall I am always reflecting on the mission of our parish. Why does St. Gall parish exist? What is our purpose? How are we doing? Jesus actually gave a clear mission for the Church with these words. Parishes often come up with long carefully crafted mission statements that attempt to express who they are and what they are about. As useful as these can be we could certainly take our Lord's concise words as the foundational mission of our parish: **St. Gall parish exists to MAKE DISCIPLES OF JESUS CHRIST**. Everything that we do at St. Gall should be related, in some way, to this basic mission of making life-long disciples of Jesus.

I think that some of us are scared off by the word "disciple." It might conjure up images of a "very religious" person living in a cave in a desert, possibly a monk, wearing sandals, doing extreme fasting and penance, praying for hours a day, following a religious guru. Some of us might think, I could never be a "disciple," I am just a regular person with a family, a job, a demanding schedule, homework, sports and activities, etc. What if, instead, we just considered a disciple to be a special kind of **FOLLOWER**. We are called to be followers of Jesus Christ.

Why should you and I follow Jesus? We should follow Jesus because he has called us. Jesus said to his disciples, "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit" (John 15:16). Specifically, Jesus called us to be his followers at the moment that we were baptized. "Having become a member of the Church, the person baptized belongs no longer to himself, but to him who died and rose for us" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1269). Through baptism Jesus calls us to <u>BELONG TO HIM</u>. He does not just want an hour of our Sundays. He wants each of us to belong to him *with all of our being*, with every part of our lives and all of who we are. Jesus said "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). Certainly, we can grow up and resist that call. But we will only find the happiness, peace, and joy that we were created to experience by being where Jesus is—by following him. Jesus does not require that we be perfect in order to follow him. He loves us in spite of our sins and weaknesses and is eager to help us continue to turn away from sin, to learn and grow with his grace. I feel so strongly about this call to discipleship that at Christmas our parish gave every family a copy of Edward Sri's book *Into His Likeness: Be Transformed as a Disciple of Christ.* Have you read it yet?

HOW we can follow Jesus

If we become convinced that we are called to follow Jesus the next hurdle that we have to face is the question of HOW we follow someone who we cannot even see, touch, or hear. How reassuring, then, are our Lord's words: "I am with you always, to the close of the age." He is with us and we can follow him and learn from him and live his life. We actually *can* learn to see, touch, and hear him. We just need to open ourselves up to his presence.

I will conclude by just briefly listing some of the ways that we can follow Jesus in our every day life. I will be exploring these more in detail during a preaching series at Masses during the Easter Season.

- **Prayer**: Through meditative prayer we are able to converse with our Triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We can share with God what is on our hearts and we can actually hear him speaking to us. We can hear him speak his Word to us especially when we take up the second way of discipleship...
- **Reading the Bible**: God has already spoken to his people. He has already spoken to you and me. We just need to pick up our Bibles and prayerfully hear his voice and speak back to him in prayer. The Bible can be intimidating for a lot of people. The Bible deserves a lifetime of study. Try starting now by reading the Gospels—I recommend the Gospel of Mark as a good place to start. Read a few verses. Try to imagine the scene. Place yourself into the scene. Ask yourself—what might the Lord want to say to me through these words? What am I prompted to say back to the Lord? Then listen quietly.
- **Receiving the sacraments**: The sacraments are the way that we experience the grace of God. Because the sacraments involve physical material signs they are ways that we "touch," "hear," and "see" God, in a sense. We can hear Jesus' words of forgiveness when we go to confession. We can take Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity into our hearts when we receive the Holy Eucharist. We look upon him in Eucharistic adoration. We can receive the healing touch of Jesus through the Anointing of the Sick. We can receive the anointing that communicates the Holy Spirit through Confirmation. We can learn what it means to participate in Jesus' faithful, sacrificial love for another person through the sacrament of Holy Matrimony. We learn from Jesus and he transforms us through the sacraments.
- **Fellowship with other disciples**: We are not meant to be isolated islands. The Acts of the Apostles says that Jesus' first followers "held steadfastly to the apostles' teaching and <u>fellowship</u>, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers" (Acts 2:42). To really grow as followers of Jesus it is not enough just to run in and out of the church for Mass once a week. We really need to find community—a smaller group of people that can help each other grow, keep each other accountable, pray for and support each other. How can we do this at St. Gall?
- Serving those in need: Jesus said that when we serve the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, and the imprisoned we actually serve HIM (Matthew 25:35-40). Jesus is actually present in the needy. He is also present in the Church as we reach out to the needy. The corporal and spiritual works of mercy are ways that we can follow Jesus every day.

Can you think of other ways that we can follow Jesus? Let's discuss this as a parish! I am grateful that you are part of St. Gall Parish and are on the journey of discipleship with me.

2019 Diocesan Appeal



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Our theme for this year's Diocesan appeal comes from the Gospel of St. John. When Jesus says "Come Follow Me" our responses can take many forms.

Where do we find Jesus? How do we follow Him? The Church itself exists to help its members encounter Christ. We find Him, for example, in the people who are served through Catholic Charities. We find Him in the sacraments, perhaps for most of us particularly in the Eucharist. We find Him also in our parish community as we learn and grow together in faith.

The Diocese of Rockford provides ministries and programs that help us all connect with and follow Christ. We have, for example, our Ministry Formation Program and Diocesan Theological Institute. They educate and empower lay members of our parishes to serve the people of God more effectively.

From this appeal, all of our priests, including those who serve your parish community, receive ongoing spiritual and fundamental support throughout their priesthood. We are educating 21 seminarians,

preparing them to be our future priests. Permanent deacons also are trained and educated through the diocese; we currently have 33 men studying to become deacons. They are answering the call to serve Christ and help others find Him as well.

Engaged couples receive valuable faith instruction through our Life and Evangelization Office (LIFE). This office also supports Respect Life efforts at parishes throughout the diocese and sponsors a pilgrimage to the March for Life each year. It also hosts the annual Silver and Gold event celebrating wedding anniversary milestones. These ministries help people follow Christ in support of life and marriage.

I would also like to mention a lesser-known ministry in the diocese. The Deaf Apostolate serves those who are hearing impaired to help them grow in their Catholic faith and receive the sacraments with enriched understanding. This important apostolate helps make the path to Christ more accessible.

These services and more happen through the support of our annual Diocesan Appeal. With your help, the Rockford Diocese will continue to introduce the people of our parishes to Jesus, walking with them every step of the way as they follow Him.

Addressing Poverty Saint Vincent de Paul Society

From the very beginning of the St. Vincent de Paul Society in Paris, France in 1833, the Society's purpose has been to increase the spiritual growth of its members through direct service to the poor. With your generous donations, our parishes Vincentians provide financial assistance, after a home visit, to parishioners in need, and the poor or homeless in the Elburn, Kaneville, Maple Park, and Virgil area. The Society's RULE states: "No form of charity is foreign to the Society." With that in mind, last year, our Society decided to take the next step, and support a new program designed to actually help families <u>move out of poverty</u>.

HOPE TAKES ACTION

The Society's "Hope Takes Action" program is designed to directly help the poor change their life, especially those in generational poverty. Using "Bridges Out of Poverty" developed by Aha Process Inc., "Hope Takes Action" Workshops helps participants prepare a personal plan and identify the necessary resources <u>they</u> need to move out of poverty. The classes are presented and supported by trained Bridges Out of Poverty facilitators and mentors. St. Gall's St. Vincent de Paul Society supports Hope Takes Action by providing mentors and a dinner during one of the sessions. 

Why are we doing this? Human life is under attack in our world. The rosary is our most powerful weapon against the attacks on life. We can pray as our Blessed Mother has asked us to do. The rosary is a simple yet efficacious way to get involved.


