BRINGING THE GOSPEL TO ELBURN DAYS

This year we did something that we never did before at our annual Elburn Days town festival. From Friday through Sunday **St. Gall had a booth** among the other "non-food commercial" organizations. We were not really selling anything. **We were just trying to give out the Gospel for free**.

Our set up was pretty simple. We had a table with a beautiful tall crucifix displayed. We had a shoe box with a slot cut out as our prayer intention box. We had a big bright orange sign with the words "NEED PRAYER?" emblazoned on it. Another sign said: "WE WILL PRAY FOR YOUR INTENTIONS EVERY THURSDAY FOR A YEAR" (Thursday being our weekly day of Eucharistic adoration in the church).

Our approach was simple. We smiled at people walking by and invited them to come write down a prayer intention and place it in the box. There were no strings attached and no commitment needed.

We did have some literature about Catholic teaching in case anyone had questions or wanted to learn more. We were prepared to share our own experiences of faith in Jesus if the conversation and the Holy Spirit opened up the door. We did not, however, wave pamphlets in people's faces or aggressively try to debate or "convert" anyone (only the Lord can convert a soul). If someone came to the table to write a prayer intention we also causally asked if they would like a free rosary or a little card that gave them some easy steps on how to pray. In many cases, conversations about faith, church, and prayer followed.

How did people respond? Very positively! Because we assumed a friendly and no-pressure posture, a lot of people looked at our booth with curiosity and felt safe to come closer. Many people made comments like, "this is such a good idea!" and "I love this!" A Polish Catholic woman from St. Charles delighted at seeing a crucifix on display at the fair. On Friday night we had one man, let's call him "Joseph," who came up to our booth. He was struggling with some things in his personal life. He was suffering from loneliness and a lack of community. Our Deacon-candidate Greg Farrell spoke to Joseph for a good thirty minutes while I and a couple other parishioners greeted and engaged others fair-goers. Once Greg's shift was over Joseph also talked to me. I could tell that Joseph needed someone to listen to him. He needed to know that someone cared about him. His father is Catholic and Joseph was baptized Catholic but not raised in the Faith. I tried to encourage him and let him know that he would be welcome to visit us at St. Gall. He said that he would. Finally, I prayed for him out loud and gave him a blessing. Would you believe that he actually showed up for the 10:30am Mass on Sunday? He had a good experience and says that he will be back. I told him that I would help him prepare for Confirmation and First Communion if he wanted.

We received 110 prayer intentions! We had many other conversations that weekend. We talked with a woman who is not Catholic but is married to a Catholic and is trying to give their daughter greater exposure to the Catholic faith—we talked about our youth ministry offerings. We talked with a lot of practicing Catholics from various parishes, but also more than a few non-practicing Catholics. We talked with Christians who attend Protestant communities like Christ Community. Even young children, middle-schoolers, and teens came up to our booth!

Of course, we had many people also just look at our booth and keep walking. Some smiled and returned a friendly "hello." Some smirked and snickered and made jokes among their friends about needing prayer. Some averted their gaze. I was surprised with how comfortable I was even with the light rejection. It was not a big deal. If Our Lord Jesus was not accepted by everyone why would we think that we should be spared rejection? Perhaps the most surprising thing was to hear that a couple *practicing Catholics* thought that our prayer tent was "weird." I heard that one Catholic likened what we were doing to the Jehovah's Witnesses! The Jehovah's Witnesses certainly have many strange and heretical beliefs. They are famous for going door-to-door and passing out literature in order to win people to their sect. Is it wrong for Catholics to try to publicly share our faith simply because some strange sects also try to share their religion in public? Evangelization is good and necessary, if done in the right way.

Maybe as Catholics we have not been raised to speak about faith and prayer in public. Maybe we were taught that religion is a private thing. The reality is that *every* Catholic is called to cultivate an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ through prayer, the study of Scripture, the reception of the sacraments, and community life, and worship at Mass. **Every Catholic needs to get comfortable talking about their faith with other people**—most especially with their spouse, children, grandchildren, relatives and friends. Gone are the days when we can just have our children go to Catholic school or religious education classes, see them through First Communion and Confirmation, and expect them to remain Catholic. The culture that we live in is hostile to Christianity, in general, and Catholicism, in particular. We need to find a way to evangelize, to share the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ by talking about our personal experience of Jesus and by inviting others to prayer and to Mass. We need to model what it looks like to live the life of a disciple of Jesus Christ—even though we are all imperfect sinners. We need to be authentic witnesses to the Christian life for the next generation. **If we do not do that then we should not be surprised when we see more and more of our children and grandchildren fall away from the Catholic faith and never come back.**

You might ask, "but Father! It is awkward to talk about my faith! I never learned how to do that. I don't know my faith well enough. I might get rejected!" Whatever our excuses are we need to get over

them. We need to rededicate ourselves to knowing our Faith, living it, and sharing it. We talk a lot about the need to evangelize these days. We need to do less talking about it and actually get out in the public square and start to do it! We will be doing more things like this in the future.

I want to thank all the volunteers who staffed the booth at different times. We will definitely be back next year!




Summer/Fall Events





Free Blood Pressure Screening



This year, the Church will celebrate Catechetical Sunday on September 15, 2019. The 2019 theme will be **"Stay with Us."** Those who the Community has designated to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry. Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith.

St. Gall Faith Formation Scripture Focus: *Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.* Luke 15:17

Bishop Robert Barron's Welcome Message:

We live in an increasingly secularized society, which powerfully influences our young people, often compelling them to leave the Church altogether. The 2018 Saint Mary's Press study, *The Dynamics of Disaffiliation in Young Catholics*, includes extensive research on young Catholics who have left the church. One of their most alarming findings was that youth stop identifying as Catholics at a median age of 13 for reasons ranging from disbelief to dissatisfaction with Church teaching.

Sociologist Christian Smith, renowned for his investigation of the phenomenon of disaffiliation, notes that many of the young people who have stopped identifying as Catholics tended to have "weak signs of attachment to the church" in the first place. In other words, they were not formed very well in the faith.

At the same time, we have signs of hope. I was blessed to participate in the Vatican's October 2018 Synod of Bishops on young people, the faith, and vocational discernment", which found that young people who end religious practice do not necessarily end their spiritual desire. The church must walk with young people and their families, listen to them with attention and love, and then be ready intelligently to give a reason for the hope that is within us.

Our resources this year are aimed on assisting the many dedicated faithful in their outreach to as missionary disciples particularly to the disaffiliated. Under our theme, Stay with Us, we have produced a variety of articles, videos and podcasts focusing on the encounter, and accompaniment which builds a community that then sends forth as missionary disciples. In his recent Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation, Christus Vivit! Pope Francis reminds us that in addition to doctrine and morality *"It is likewise important that it have two main goals. One is the development of the kerygma, the foundational experience of encounter with God through Christ's death and resurrection. The other is growth in fraternal love, community life and service... All Christian formation consists of entering more deeply into the kerygma and incarnating it ever more fully in our lives. (213-214)*

May our lives be an imitation of Jesus' encounter with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35) and accompany those entrusted to us into full community and discipleship.

We are a missionary Church. Jesus defined the Church as missionary through His Great Commission when He said, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations…"

In fact, recent studies have identified this group as the fastest growing religious demographic in America.

Pope Francis calls us "to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the 'peripheries' in need of the light of the Gospel" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 20).




