

WE ALL WANT A PARISH THAT IS ALIVE!: Parish Vitality Update



Music at Mass: The Pastoral Council has met a few times since we received the results of the Parish Vitality Survey. We have had some very fruitful discussion. As I announced earlier many people expressed a desire for more contemporary liturgical music at Mass. I am preparing to order a supplemental resource with more contemporary music options (this resource will not be available until the start of Advent). Ken Wagman, our Director of Sacred Music, will work with me to incorporate some more contemporary music that still meets the Church's requirements for

appropriate sacred liturgical music. When it comes to sacred music at Mass we still have the goal of putting into practice the teachings of the Second Vatican Council, the instruction of the U.S. Bishops (see their document *Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship*) and the principles laid out in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal. As a result, we will still continue to make use of chant, traditional hymnody, the singing of proper antiphons, the occasional use of Latin, and our beautiful organ. It is such a joy to worship God with the St. Gall parish community!

Youth Ministry: The Parish Vitality Survey also demonstrated a need for us to continue to make a vibrant home for our youth here at St. Gall. In our recent Pastoral Council meeting our Director of Youth Ministry, Katie Pyles, has talked about the ways that we are trying to enrich our youth ministry program. We want our Youth Ministry to complement our Faith Formation program so that our children can grow as life-long disciples of Jesus Christ. This will be no easy task. There are many obstacles to ministering to youth today. School activities, sports, and other extracurricular activities have left many of our middle schoolers and teens with schedules that are so booked up that they do not have time to cultivate friendships and community centered around faith in Jesus Christ. Katie has been working hard to talk with parents to see what we can do to meet the needs of their children. We have launched a couple small groups where kids meet together, under the leadership of adult mentors, and we talk about how we can live out our Catholic faith in our daily lives. I have personally seen amazing fruit already from these groups! We are also working on retooling some of our large group offerings to better fit with the schedules of our youth. We will also continue to promote Camp Wow for Middle Schoolers and the Steubenville Youth Conference for our teens. No one knows your children better than you. What can we do to help your children connect with their faith and grow? Please, please, please talk to us about it! Get in touch with Katie or myself. We cannot have a vibrant parish at St. Gall without YOUR help and involvement.

Time and Talent Survey: Lastly, I have worked with the Pastoral Council and other members of the parish to prepare a time and talent survey. With the Parish Vitality survey we solicited feedback about various areas of our parish life. Thank you so much! That was very helpful. Now, I need to hear back from all of the members of our parish about what they can do to help our parish be really alive. Every person at our parish has gifts that God has given them. Are we all putting those gifts to use here at the parish? I want to take the opportunity to thank everyone who has generously given of their time, talent, and treasure over the years. Where would we be without you?

I would love it if every single member of our parish was involved in at least one ministry or was able to contribute one of their talents in some way. Imagine what our parish could be then! I suspect that there are a lot of gifts and talents in our parish that are hidden (Matthew 5:15-16). What can we do to help you bring your talent out?

May we all continue to grow every day in the love of Jesus Christ, with the assistance of the prayers of Our Lady,

Special thanks to Denise and Wayne Parchert for heading this annual event once again!








STORY OF THE CANDY CANE


The Candy Cane was first introduced in the late 1880's by a candy-maker in Indiana. He wanted to make a candy that could be a witness during the holiday season. He began with a stick of pure, white to show the virgin birth and the sinless nature of Jesus Christ. The hardness of the candy was to represent Jesus as the Solid Rock, the foundation of the church, and the firmness of the promises of God. The white stripes on the Candy Cane represent the purity of Christ. The small red stripes symbolize the scourging of Jesus before he was hung on the cross. The large red stripes show the blood that Jesus shed for each of us on the cross.

The shape of the Candy Cane represents the shepherd's staff because Jesus is the good shepherd. If you flip the Candy Cane around, you will notice the letter "J" which is the first letter of Jesus' name.

Have a Merry Christmas and always remember the reason for the season...and the candy cane!
